### PART 28: KING DAVID THE PSALM WRITER

#### EARLY TRAINING

As we examine the life and faith of David, there are a number of different areas we need to look at.

1. David was the youngest of his brothers and took care of the family's sheep. This was not a glamorous job and was considered to be the lowest of all vocations. **1 Samuel 16:11**
2. David used his time as a shepherd to develop the skill of the sling and was a young teenager of great courage. **1 Samuel 17:32-37**
3. David liked to sing, play the harp and compose songs. **1 Samuel 16:14-23**
4. David had a deep faith in God and this removed all fear from him as he trusted God to help him. **1 Samuel 17:38-51**

#### DAVID – THE WORSHIPPER

The Bible records David's battles with King Saul, the lean years before he became the King of Israel, the wars he fought, his moral failures, his dysfunctional family due to having so many wives, and his desire to build a temple for the Lord.



- ❖ Have mercy on me. **Psalm 51**
- ❖ Bless the Lord of my soul. **Psalm 103**
- ❖ Praise ye the Lord. **Psalm 150**
